Child Care Subsidy



Child Care Subsidy (CCS) provides assistance to help you with the cost of child care.

How does it work?

If you are eligible to receive the Child Care Subsidy (CCS), your entitlements will be paid <u>directly to</u> <u>the service</u> your child is attending. The service will then deduct CCS from your child's regular fees, leaving you with only a gap to pay for your child's enrolment.

Some basic requirements must be satisfied for an individual to be eligible to receive Child Care Subsidy for a child. These include:

- the age of the child (must be 13 or under and not attending secondary school)
- the child must meet immunisation requirements
- the individual, or their partner, must meet the residency requirements.


How much will I receive?

Four things will determine a family's level of Child Care Subsidy:

- A family's annual adjusted taxable income will determine the percentage of subsidy they are eligible for
- 2. Families with **more than one child aged 5 or under in care** can get a higher subsidy for their second child and younger children.
- 3. An **activity test** will determine how many hours of subsidised care families can access, up to a maximum of 100 per fortnight, and
- 4. The **type of child care service** will determine the hourly rate cap.

CCS Rates from 10 July 2023

Family income	Subsidy rate
\$0 to \$80,000	90%
More than \$80,000 to below \$530,000	Decreasing from 90% The percentage decreases by 1% for every \$5,000 of income a family earns
\$530,000 or more	0%

Rates for Second and Younger Children from 10 July 2023

Family income	Second and younger children subsidy rate
\$0 to \$138,118	95%
More than \$138,118 to below \$183,118	Decreasing from 95% The percentage decreases by 1% for every \$3,000 of income a family earns
\$183,118 to below \$262,408	80%
\$262,408 to below \$352,408	Decreasing from 80% The percentage decreases by 1% for every \$3,000 of income a family earns
\$352,408 to below \$362,408	50%
\$362,408 or more	Higher CCS rates no longer apply, all children in the family will receive the standard CCS rate

How to Apply for Child Care Subsidy

In order to apply for Child Care Subsidy, you will need a Centrelink CRN (Customer Reference Number).

If you have already set up a CRN with Centrelink:

You can usually find your CRN on any correspondence from Centrelink. You should already have a CRN if you have received Centrelink payments before. It would be noted in a letter from Centrelink. The CRN consists of 10 characters – 9 numbers and a letter in the end, for example, 123456789A. If you can't locate your CRN, please call Centrelink directly to obtain this.


If you have never set up a CRN with Centrelink:

- You will need to visit a service centre to confirm your identity in order to receive a CRN. Make sure you have your ID with

- During your visit, we recommend you also ask to set up a <u>Centrelink online account</u>.

Once you have your CRN, follow the steps below:

Step 1. Sign in to your <u>myGov</u> account. If you don't have one, you will need to <u>create a myGov</u> account.


To create a MyGov account, go to www.my.gov.au and click on 'Create an account'. Follow the instructions from there.



Step 2. Link myGov to Centrelink. You can do this under Account Settings.

To connect Centrelink with myGov, you will need an Online account with Centrelink OR a linking code that was given to you by Centrelink OR your Customer reference number (CRN). If you don't have a CRN or a linking code and you haven't created a Centrelink account before, you will need to visit your nearest Centrelink office to receive




Step 3. Get into the Centrelink Account, and Select Menu from your homepage.




Step 4. Select Payments and Claims Select Claims Select Make a claim.



Step 5. On the Make a Claim page, select Get started in the Families category.


On the Make a Claim page, select Get started in the Families category.



Step 6. Select Apply for Family Assistance (including Paid Parental Leave).

Answer all the questions. You may need to work through more than 1 page.

Then select Next.



Step 7. Claim for Child Care Subsidy

Select Child Care Subsidy, then select Claim now.

Check your details in My Profile to make sure they're up to date.

Step 8. Complete a Child Care Subsidy Assessment.

To begin your claim, select Get started in Confirm your basic details.

You will need to supply details about your situation and finances, and may need to provide supporting evidence. You will have the opportunity to Review your claim before submission.
